Yearbook ES: For the 2019-2020 ES Yearbook we are going with Balfour again, but with a new sales representative. I have signed a contract for 270 soft-cover books, 72 pages, full-color, with another custom cover at a cost of $\$ 14.77 / \mathrm{book}$. We are selling the books for $\$ 16 /$ book and there is a $\$ 1$ processing fee (Balfour's). The cost of the
books will increase January 1st, 2020 to $\$ 18 /$ book to promote early sales. This year we will be offering Love Lines $\$ 2 /$ each and Grad Ads $\$ 8 /$ each. Love Lines will be available for all grades and Grad Ads limited to 5th graders. The Grad Ads will be designed by the parent/guardian so each will be individual to the student. Need more clarification on how parents do the design.
Cover was designed by a student, the back will be a collage with all who submit a design.
Last year 300 hardcover books were purchased with roughly 50 leftover at the end of the year. However, the year before (2017) we sold 291 books so we decided to sign for 270 this year. We are able to change the order number no later than January 31st, 2020; we will make that decision when the time comes based on how many have been ordered online.
The first payment, $1 / 3$ of the total cost, is due January 10th, 2020, second $1 / 3$ due March 15th, 2020 and remaining due after books are delivered. Delivery date of the yearbooks is set for May 5th, 2020.
My next meeting with the Balfour representative will be October 23rd to check progress.

Book Fair: • Book Fair 9/26-10/4• 9/25 Setup - Scholastic Rep came to help, and this was an amazing experience •9/25 Book Fair Preview for faculty and volunteers $\circ$ This was a great way for new volunteers to meet us and check out the book fair prior to their shift. - Volunteers made amazing refreshments • Family Reading night for K 2nd 9/26, Book Fair open until 6pm - Most profitable day. ○ Definitely wouldn't have made our goal without an activity like this. ○ Donated $\$ 180$ in SD to her event • eWallet totalled $\$ 701.64$ with 28 signups • online shopping $\$ 100 \bullet$ New this book fair - All for books, raised $\$ 146.38 \circ$ This was rounding up at the register or playing 1 of two games a) pencil pull or b) puffin egg. o Till was split between Mrs. Ramos and Mrs. Kennedy, which was chosen randomly • Sales are being finalized, but it looks like: ○ Total sales $\$ 11970.91$, $\$ 600$ more than last fall $\circ \$ 1250$ in Scholastic Dollars and $\circ$ $\$ 2367.37$ in cash • Volunteers $\circ$ Middle School kids dressed up or escorted as Geronimo Stilton and Clifford, this really added to the excitement of the book fair - highly recommend in the future. ○ The book fair dug out several new faces! o Volunteers were awarded about \$190 SD for their support. - \$313 SD was spent on books for the school, future rewards, and provide extra support to Mrs. Dunn (She lost books in her move and her classroom library was bare) - New this book fair "fairy money" via SD \$22. Typically Jaime would save up change for a month and we'd take care of the student overages on books, but it would never be more than $\$ 0.50$. This method allowed us to give more, which helps us sell more books instead of turning the kids away. VERY important to have an event at least one evening during Book Fair. Need better marketing. - Marie-Celine Murawski and Michelle Wood

Boxtops: 1. Preparations are almost complete for our first box tops competition for this school year. Letters will go home with all RES students this week announcing the classroom competition which will run from October 9-25. The letter will encourage parents to load the new box tops app on their phones to make even more money for our schools, but the contest will only count unexpired "classic" clipped box tops.
2. Email will also go out this week to the twelve PTO members who have volunteered to help with the box tops program asking for their help with the contest this month.
